
### Saturday, September 13 10am to Noon

Edward and Ramona Comrie, neighbors to the north of the Library, stepped forward and offered to donate their front yard for the expansion. Everything changed with that act of generosity. The design picked up in popularity and raising funds became easier.

Paula Marcus offered her services as contract monitor and Ledyard General was selected as the contractor of choice. Ground was broken on September 16, 1990 with great public celebration.

For the next two years as construction and restoration proceeded, the aforementioned committees were extremely busy and

successful in fundraising, building monitoring, interior decisions and gaining community




involvement. A State construction grant added needed financial support.

The Library, with the new addition, re-opened to the public at the Dedication/Ribbon cutting ceremony on May 17, 1992. It was a grand

**Wally Lamb** is speaking at the Library's fundraiser at Snediker's Yacht Restoration on **September 27**.

As you all know by now, his latest book, *The River is Waiting*, was chosen for Oprah's Book Club, as were his earlier novels, *She's Come Undone*, and *I Know this Much is True*.

As happy as we were for Wally to get the

call from Oprah for a third time (and he told us that she actually makes the calls herself!), we were afraid that the honor would make it more difficult to get him to speak at our fundraiser.

And indeed, it was. His publicist blew us off several times. I had almost given up, but our friends at Bank Square Books allowed me to cut the line at the bookstore to speak with him directly. When I told him we wanted him to speak at our Library fundraiser, he looked me in the eye and asked, "When is it?" and then gave me his personal email.

When we agreed on a date (thanks again to David Snediker, who generously offered his boatyard as the location for the fundraiser), Wally assured me that, because his talk is a fundraiser for the Library, he would not go through his publicist and he would do it gratis.

I can't say I was surprised. He is that kind of a guy. I didn't go to NFA with him, nor was I a student of his, but I had my own reasons for knowing that this is the guy. Many years ago, I

attended a CT Library Association conference where he was speaking. He brought with him, to be on a panel, women who were prisoners at York Correctional Institute in Niantic. He brought them to tell their stories. I still remember seeing these women, dressed to the nines, telling their stories. Wally

taught a writing workshop at York every week for 20 years. Out of that came their book, Couldn't Keep it to Myself: Testimonies from Our Imprisoned Sisters. Who does that?

Renowned author Wally Lamb's new book is titled *The River is Waiting*. But those of us living here on the banks of the Mystic River won't have to wait to dive into this book. Mr. Lamb has kindly agreed to be our featured guest at the Mystic & Noank Library's Annual Author Talk fundraising event, scheduled for Saturday, September 27th, 5:00-7:00 pm at Snediker Yacht Restoration in Old Mystic.

Wally Lamb is the author of six NY Times bestselling novels, and this newest novel is his third to be selected by Oprah Winfrey for her Book Club, which she said shows what she thinks of "this truly masterful and beloved writer." Considering all that acclaim, you would think it would be impossible that our beloved Library would be able to secure Mr. Lamb for our annual author talk fundraiser, right? But, we have a lot going for us. For starters, Wally Lamb is a Connecticut treasure having been born and raised in Norwich, attended UCONN, taught English at Norwich Free Academy and later directed the creative writing department at UCONN. Our wonderful Executive Director, Christine Bradley, was able to extend our invitation in person to Wally when he appeared at Bank Square Books for a book signing. Chris said Wally didn't even hesitate to accept our offer and support the MNL as our featured author for 2025.

We are so thrilled to have him at our Author Talk this year!

As you probably know, the MNL is a non-profit association library. Each year our Board and Staff are tasked with producing more than 65% of our annual operating expenses. Tickets for this exclusive occasion are priced at \$125 per person and include the reception. Just use this link to get your tickets:



Göran creatively found a position at the Mystic Seaport Museum Bookstore and finally edited the Seaport's magazine. Then the pandemic hit; life changed for everyone.

Back in Sweden, Göran had been an avid rower. A friend approached him to edit a rowing anthology, *The Greatest Rowing Stories Ever Told*. (You can now find it at the M&NL.) Göran continues to put out a blog on rowing, and our very own Philip Kuepper contributes a poem each week.





Of all the choirs existing in the world, I would be assigned to direct the Choir of Dawn. Imagine having to corral a herd of birds: wren, robin. finch. dove. a cardinal (no less), a catbird, a jay, and a veritable chorus of sparrows.
